School Funds

We rely on our school funds to meet the costs that Department of Education funding does not meet. Uniform & Grooming

It is expected that students wear full school uniform as detailed in the uniform policy (overleaf).

We thank all parents for continuing to fully support the college's uniform policy. Non-uniform tops will not be allowed anytime during the school day this year and we ask parents to consider purchasing the school jumper from local stockists. School shoes must be worn, and letters of exemption will not be accepted unless from an appropriate medical professional with an end date included. Previous exemptions from last year will not be accepted this year. Parents are reminded that students must not present to college in September with extreme hair styles or facial piercings.

Students in Years 11-14 will not be issued a college homework diary this year. After consultation with parents and pupils, strong preference was shown to continued use of the Parent App for communication of study and assignment details. Sacred Heart College Uniform Policy

Our school uniform identifies the boys and girls as students of Sacred Heart College. While wearing it, students represent the college, its values and its traditions. Care has been taken to ensure that uniform items are generic, affordable and offer value for money in relation to non-uniform items.

Proper attire and good grooming, as well as neatness and cleanliness, is expected of the students at all times. The college reserves the right to set the standards in relation to uniform and appearance. Students are encouraged to wear their uniform with dignity and pride and parental cooperation is always greatly appreciated.

College Uniform

The uniform consists of;

- grey coloured trousers/skirt, white shirt, school tie and school blazer. School ties and blazers are available from local uniform stockists.
- A V-neck school jumper may also be worn (also available from local stockists). No other top may be worn at any time during the school day.
- Students who wear a skirt must always wear tights during the school year.
- Students unable to wear tights should wear school trousers
- Skirts should be no shorter than knee length.
- Trousers should be regular school trousers
- Pupils who wear trousers must wear regular dark coloured socks

PE Uniform

• PE uniform consists of college shorts/leggings and college PE shirt (available from stockists)

• On days when students have scheduled recreational PE lessons, they may wear PE uniform to and from school. On these days, students must wear plain navy or black leggings/training bottoms and a college top over their PE shirt. No other non-uniform clothing is permissible. *

*Please note this is a privilege that may be revoked if students do not comply with the policy in full.

• Students may bring PE uniform to school and change in the PE changing rooms before and after their PE lessons.

Footwear

• Black school shoes are compulsory for all students. Trainers and canvas type footwear are not permissible. (see overleaf)

- Trainers may be worn as part of PE uniform kit only.
- Students with a written diagnosis from an appropriate medical professional stating that they cannot wear shoes will be exempt.

Overcoats

• Only a plain navy or black overcoat may be worn to and from school. Overcoats must not be worn during the school day except for break and lunch time. No other type of overcoat is permissible.
